Trans-EuroAsian Logistics Platform: Network Cooperation to Connect Eurasian Economic Union and the Silk Road Economic Belt

Questions:

- What potential does the Trans-EuroAsian Logistics platform as a technology of network cooperation among companies possess to implement the import substitution strategy and to develop exports (apart from raw materials) from firms and regions?
- When forming regional strategies, how does an innovative activity need to be organized to participate in global supply chains (GSC), global value creation chains (GVC) and global product chains, as well as to optimize corporate costs in the regions?
- What cooperation forms, ways to integrate business processes, technologies and projects contribute to the reduction of corporate costs, total production, delivery costs and the increase of value added for clients in the regions? What cross-sectoral industrial and logistical clusters may become centers of economic growth in the regions?
- What are the instruments/ technologies to connect the Eurasian Economic Union and the Silk Road Economic Belt? New geography and structure of the flows of goods. What big regional transportation and logistics centers can be attractive in order to connect the transportation and logistics infrastructures? According to what criteria can they be defined? Options for the new design of logistics supply chains.

Goal of the discussion: to define the efficiency of the target model for the cargo market that is suggested by the authorities; to discover business approaches for supply chain management under the companies' network cooperation; to suggest regional authorities instruments/technologies to minimize total costs, while developing a horizontal management pattern based on trade and industry cooperation.

Questions:

- How can we use instruments of strategic planning and management so that an organization could take part in the global supply chains and global value creation chains for the clients?
- What are the practical aspects of creating new products while managing supply chains with the help of strategic management methods?
- What needs to be done in logistics to safeguard the efficiency of the targeted cargo delivery market?
- How can we motivate a company in the EuroAsian economic space to minimize total costs based on network cooperation?

Logistics and EuroAsian Air Transportation Links

Goal: to find out opportunities for Russia’s air transportation market in the EuroAsian economic cooperation; to define managerial solutions for Russian air space in order to develop cargo transportation by air on the route Asia – Europe – Asia; to suggest instruments/technologies to minimize total costs for customers, air companies, airports and logistics services providers with the help of network cooperation.

Questions

- Where does a Russian air transportation market go: from deregulation to monopolization or liberalization? What is the logistics of air transportation?
- Logistics of airline business networks: monopolization or cooperation?
- Development directions for Russian air transportation: airports, aviation hubs, aerotropolis, air transportation logistics clusters.
- How can we increase the efficiency of logistical business processes in Russian airports and air transportation hubs? What is a priority: foreign hubs, Domodedovo project, Koltsovo, Tolmachevo, Vladivostok airports, project “Regional airports”?
- “Open sky” – Does Russia need to develop logistics of business networks for air cargo transportation China – Europe; Asia- Pacific- EU- America?
